Re: Wacom Operations Affected by the Great East Japan Earthquake (4)

Wacom Co., Ltd. updated its status on the influence of the Great East Japan Earthquake which struck on March 11. Please refer to the details below.

1. Status of damage:

i) Employees working at domestic site

All employees are currently reported to be safe.

ii) Domestic site

While the administration building and factory building headquarters (Kazo-shi, Saitama Prefecture) were partially damaged, we have resumed our normal operations. No damage in the Tokyo branch or in each domestic office (Nagoya, Osaka, Fukuoka) has been recognized. The recorded loss resulting from investigating earthquake damage of the administration and factory building headquarters was evaluated to 197 million yen which includes the recovery cost in the factory building and the disposal cost etc. of scrap and debris.

2. Influence on the production activity

Most of the production facilities are overseas and our domestic factory has already resumed its normal operations. We have confirmed that there are no difficulties in parts supply except for the ultra-high-density panel of the large-scale LCD tablet for the professional market. Outside influences which include parts suppliers and partners' operations near the circumference of the ruined area, the power supply situation and systems of distribution etc. are expected to influence production activity in the future. The influence on production activities will be suppressed to a minimum by having close cooperation with our suppliers and partners.

3. About compensating for the blackout

Although rolling blackouts are not probable for the present, Wacom copes with

blackouts by using private electric generators and by providing flexible work hours to its staff. By these means Wacom secures enough electric power for the facilities (except air-conditioners) and even during blackouts production activity continues normally.

4. Influence on the latest forecast:

Wacom received a financial loss of 197 million yen (due to the Great East Japan Earthquake disaster) and considers it an extraordinary loss at the period of FY10 ended on March 2011 as a result of investigating damage to the administration and factory buildings. There is no major modification in the consolidated business forecasts of FY10.

Wacom expresses its deepest sympathies for those affected by the disaster and sincerely hopes for a quick recovery.
